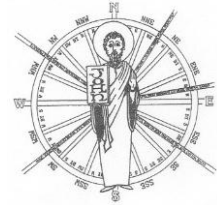

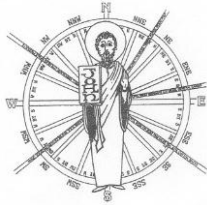

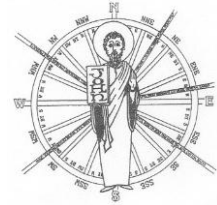
Zero Tolerance
