


Welcome back after the half term break.






Each questionnaire is anonymous and confidential. Children will be asked about their opinion on a number of health and wellbeing themes.



Late Collection of children from school

Unfortunately due to the number of children not being collected from school on time at the end of the day, we now have a 'Late Club'. We have had to increase the staffing at the school to facilitate the late collection of children.

Therefore, any parent who is more than 5 minutes late collecting their child on a regular basis will be charged £4 which is payable on collection. If you are over 15 minutes late your child will be put in After School Club which will incur an £8.00 fee. Of course we understand that everyone is late occasionally but this will be in place from Monday 31st October.
