

Please note – we cannot allow parents/carers to attend assemblies if they arrive after 3pm. Late arrivals are disruptive to the children performing.


Please be advised that once the assembly has started a sign will be put up on the school door, there will be no further admittance.

School Gate


We will be using the Fire Gates for the next few weeks, until work is completed to ensure the Main Gate is safe to use.
