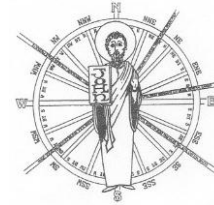

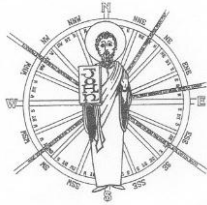

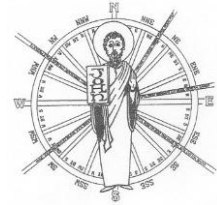

CAFOD

This week in assembly a speaker from Cafod explained about the work of this Catholic charity and the fund raising project 'Make a Splash'.

We have made a great start to this fund-raising with the playtime biscuit sales. Thank you for supporting this. We have made £63.51 so far for the charity and we will continue with our fund-raising in April as it is part of our work for the Year of Mercy. The amount we collect will be match funded by the Government. This means that the biscuit sales will actually result in £127.02 being donated to Cafod.
