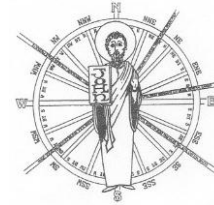

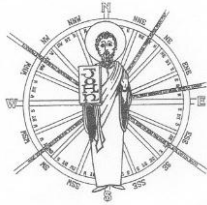
24th March – Easter Hat Parade
