We will also be learning an array of counting rhymes and nursery rhymes.




In the second half term the children will be learning about 'Food'. The children will have the opportunity to taste and prepare a range of foods and will read stories connected to food such as 'The tiger who came to tea' and 'I will not ever eat a tomato'.



The scope of learning will cover the seven areas of development in the Foundation Stage.

Reminders

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- Please give your child a labelled **water** bottle.
 - Please ensure that your child brings their book bag into Nursery every day so that we can put their pictures and school letters in it, as well as a sharing book.
 - Children take home a sharing book on Tuesday and Friday. Please ensure that you read this to your child and write a comment in their reading record. It is important that you talk to your child about the story and pictures and make this a fun time for them.
 - A change of clothes is needed in the event of an accident, please ensure they are clearly labelled.
 - Please check all garments are marked with your child's name.
 - It is essential that you inform the nursery staff if your child has or develops an allergy.
 - Please dress your child in loose clothing that is easier for them to manage i.e. track suit bottoms or leggings.
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
