Seven times?" "No, not seven times," answered Jesus, "but seventy times seven." (based on Matthew 18:21-22)</p> <p>How easy do you find it to forgive someone? How easy do you find it to say sorry to someone?</p> <p><i>Pactise this with a family member. What words do you use? What facial expression do you have?</i></p> <p>Say this prayer and think about when you have said sorry to someone. <i>God, Our Father, thank you for loving me. I am sorry for the times I have not shown love to others. Help me always to live like Jesus. Amen</i></p> <p>Using the first letter of the word PEACE make up a prayer or a poem, include reasons why it is important to keep the peace at home.</p> 	 <p>When Jesus was teaching, someone came up to him and asked him what he thought was the greatest commandment of all.</p> <p>This is what Jesus replied:</p> <p>'You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength.'</p> <p>The second most important commandment is this:</p> <p>"Love your neighbour as yourself. There is no other commandment more important than these two."</p> <p>Which is easier – to love God or to love your neighbour. Is there a difference?</p> <p>Why do you think love of God and our neighbour is so important?</p> <p>Remember a time when you have reached out to someone you have hurt or offended. Describe how the bridge was broken and give reasons for how you rebuilt the bridge.</p> <p>Choose one of the quotes above and use this to make a card for someone – decorate it with symbols of love and friendship.</p>	<p>Based on Isaiah 58</p>  <p>What brings me joy is everything that brings freedom:</p> <p>a kindly word for someone who is worried;</p> <p>a helping hand for someone in trouble.</p>  <p>if they give clothes to those in need and work at bringing happiness to their family and friends, I see my love growing in them.</p>  <p>This is what pleases me, and they will become signs of hope for everyone, like a bright sunrise after a long dark night.</p> <p>What are some of the positive things God wants us to do? How does Isaiah's advice link with the Ten Commandments? Can we keep the rules that God gives us and why? Why has Isaiah used the idea of sunrise in the last line. What do you think it means?</p> <p>Design a poster entitled 'Be one of God's people!' illustrating the actions which Isaiah tells us please God. Why do people who believe in God behave in this way?</p>
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
