
**Monday June 29th is the Feast Day of St Peter and St Paul**

### FEAST OF SAINTS PETER AND PAUL

On 29th June the Church celebrates the feast day of two great saints, Peter and Paul. Their personal backgrounds and individual lives were very different.

Peter, who received this special name, meaning 'Rock', from Jesus himself, was one of his first chosen disciples and was named by him as leader of the Twelve, the apostles. Paul never met Jesus in his time on earth. He only met Jesus after Jesus had risen. This took place on the road to Damascus, an event which changed Saul of Tarsus into Paul, apostle to the Gentiles, those who were not Jews. What joined them was their love of Jesus and their martyr-death in the city of Rome, Peter by crucifixion and Paul, as a Roman citizen, by beheading with the sword.

I followed Jesus. I listened to him. Click on the image.</p>  <p>Paul was a good letter writer, so he was given the job of telling people about Jesus. Paul travelled to many countries, such as Crete and Italy. He also wrote to people in other countries, such as Greece. His talent was telling people about God.</p> <p><b>Write a letter as Paul to tell people about what your religion means to you and your family.</b></p>	<p>Read through this KS2 power point about St Peter and St Paul. Click on the image.</p>  <p>Paul was a good speaker and letter writer, so he was given the job of telling people about Jesus. Paul travelled to many countries, such as Crete and Italy. He also wrote to people in other countries, such as Greece. His talent was telling people about God. He used that talent well.</p> <p>As you get older, when you meet people who are not Catholic, or do not go to a Catholic School, they might ask you about your religion. Be proud of what you believe in.</p> <p><b>Can you write a short speech to explain to someone who is not Catholic what this means to you?</b></p>



