


Nursery Learning Grid Week of 18<sup>th</sup> January 2021



<p><b>PHONICS/LITERACY</b></p> <p>Our story this week is 'Winnie's Pirate Adventure'.</p>  <p><a href="#">Here</a> is the link to listen to Miss Childs read the story. Below is a template of Winnie, can you turn her into a pirate?</p>		<p>Play 'Kim's game'</p> <p>This phonics game will help your child hear the initial sound in words whilst developing your child's memory and concentration.</p> <p>Instructions to play this game are attached on Wednesday's activities (see below)</p>		<p>This week we have been learning the sound 'a-a-a'.</p> <p>Now have a go at writing/mark making an 'a.'</p> <p>You can practice writing the letter on your whiteboard that was in your resource pack.</p> <p>See Friday's activities below for this week's sound card and help with the letter formation.</p>

<p><b>MATHS</b></p>	<p>We sing lots of number songs in Nursery, practice singing one of our favourite songs: 5 Little Monkeys Swinging in a Tree.</p> <p><a href="#">Here</a> is a link to a video of the song your child should recognise.</p>		<p>Can you name some 2d shapes?</p> <p>In Nursery we have been learning these shape names; circle, square, rectangle and triangle.</p> <p>Miss Childs found some things in our classroom that are these shapes (see Thursday's activity below). What shapes can you find in your house?</p>	
<p><b>UTW</b></p> <p>Discover where pirates travelled? Explore the oceans on a map - or on a globe or in an Atlas if you have one! Pirates were real people who lived on ships. Their ships sometimes sunk in the oceans. Test different materials or objects, which float and which sink?</p>	<p><b>EAD</b></p> <p>Can you make a pirate ship that floats in water? Think about which materials will float.</p> <p>See Tuesday activities to see some pirate ships we made in Nursery from our junk modelling.</p>	<p><b>PD</b></p> <p>In Nursery we enjoy playing with playdough. <i>It's a great way to develop your child's finger muscles ready for writing and it's easy to make.</i></p> <p>See the recipe below.</p> <p>Have fun making shapes with the play dough.</p>	<p><b>PSED</b></p> <p>Talk about the rights and wrongs of a Pirate's life.</p> <p>Can we take things that we want from others?</p> <p>How would that make others feel?</p>	<p><b>RE</b></p> <p>Topic: Celebration Talk to your child about 'the parish family'. Talk about what they already know about celebrating in church. For example, Baptism, Christmas and weddings. Talk about the parish family celebrating. Show your child the images from Church Story (below) and discuss what the pictures show about the people of the parish.</p>

SNAP!


One little monkey, swinging in a tree,

## PHONICS

### **Kim's game**

Playing Kim's game is a good way of developing your child's memory skills and concentration as well as practising our phonics sounds.

To play you need to find 5 objects/pictures that start with the sound a-a-a (e.g. apple, arrow, ambulance, astronaut, and ant). Show your child the objects and tell them the name of each object, emphasising the a-a-a sound. Cover all 5 objects with a blanket and take one away, ask your child if they can spot what object is missing. To make the game more challenging you can add more objects.

### PD

Here is a quick and easy playdough recipe. You will need:



- 8 tbsp plain flour
- 2 tbsp table salt
- 1 tbsp vegetable oil
- Food colouring (optional)

Method:

1. Mix the flour and salt in a large bowl. In a separate bowl mix together the water, a few drops of food colouring and the oil.
2. Pour the coloured water into the flour mix and bring together with a spoon.
3. Dust a work surface with a little flour and turn out the dough. Knead together for a few minutes to form a smooth, pliable dough. If you want a more intense colour you can work in a few extra drops of food colouring.


Bounce: a-a-a-a-apple

down the leaf


