ENGLISH Over the next few weeks, you are going to be reading the story of Beowulf, an Anglo-Saxon legend.  Read the passage from the story (below the grid).  Grendel is described as "hideous and evil" but we do not know what he looks like.  Using your imagination, write a paragraph which describes what YOU THINK Grendel looks like.  Spellings to pracise this week: Suffix - ion:  information, adoration, sensation, preparation, vibration, admiration, temptation, creation, education, punctuation.	Read the text from yesterday again and answer the following questions in sentences.  1. In what country does this story take place? Explain HOW you know.  2. Write down THREE phrases which show that the Danes were having fun in Heorot.  3. How did Grendel feel about the Danes having fun? Give reasons for your answer.  4. Why do you think Grendel chose to attack at night?  5. How many people died in the attack?  Mr. Burns thinks there were no more than 35 people in Heorot on the night of the attack. Use the text to explain why you think he is correct/incorrect.	Imagine you are Grendel, write a diary entry which explains what happened on the day of the attack.  See the plan for each paragraph below the grid.  Remember to link your ideas and paragraphs using fronted adverbials. Use a range of tenses and expanded noun phrases to develop your descriptions.  When you have finished, go back and edit your work to improve it.	Imagine you are one of the survivors. Write a letter to a friend which explains events on the night of the attack.  Spend fifteen minutes planning your letter. Focus on the KEY events from YOUR point of view.  Here is an example of how you might start your letter.  Dear Ilia,  How are you? I cannot believe it's been six months since I last heard from you! I hope that you and your family all well and surviving the harshness of these cold winter months. Thankfully, Freda and I have stored enough foodstuffs to ensure I don't have to go hunting this winter and risk the possibility of running into that terrifying beast, Grendel. I'm sure you will have read by now about the attack on Heorot a few weeks ago. I was there that night and, let me tell you, it was a night I will never ever forget.  When you have finished, go back and edit your work to make sure you have included adverbials, a range of tenses and expanded noun phrases.	Spellings: Suffix - ion:  information, adoration, sensation, preparation, vibration, admiration, temptation, creation, education, punctuation.  Write each of these words in a sentence. 


## **Message Space**
