



Punctuality



It has been noted that certain families are consistently late arriving at school in the morning.

Being punctual for school means making sure your child is at school and ready to learn before the school gate shuts at 8.55am.

There are many ways to ensure your child is on time for school, from making sure their school bags are packed the night before to making sure they get up with plenty of time to eat and get ready.

Equally as important, are good sleeping patterns; please make sure your child is getting the required amount of sleep every night. This will support their overall health, how they grow, learn and play!
