School Attendance

At the end of this week every child will be bringing home their current attendance record. This is will be based on the **Summer Term only**. Our overall aim as a school is for children's attendance to be above 97%. Any child with a percentage lower than 93% is classed, at this school, as a 'Persistant Absentee'. If your attendance report is on **green** paper then please congratulate yourself on your child's good attendance which is **over 96%**. **Orange** paper means that your child is in the danger zone of between 93-96%. However, if your child's attendance is on **red** paper they are below the 93% mark and are considered a Persistant Absentee, their attendance will be monitored on a regular basis.
