This could include brightly coloured socks, patterned tights, funky headwear, bow ties etc. Be creative but the base must still be the uniform!

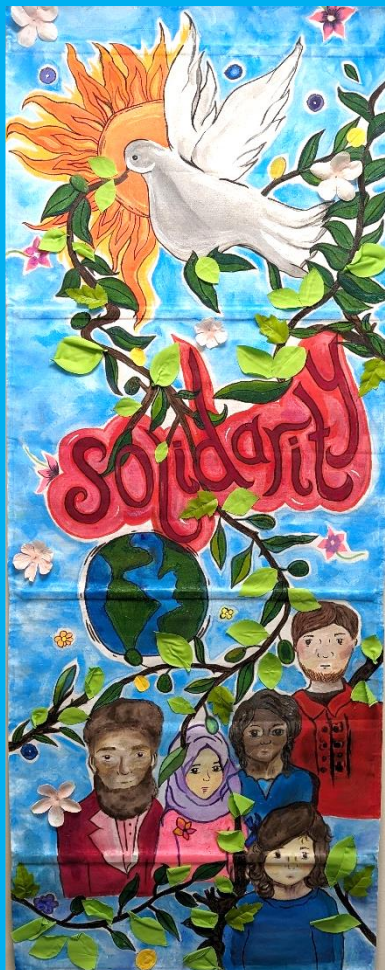
