This week we had a special assembly to celebrate all those who made their First Holy Communion this year – congratulations.

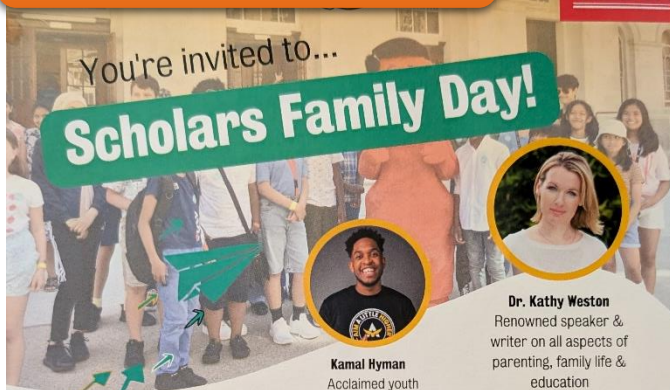

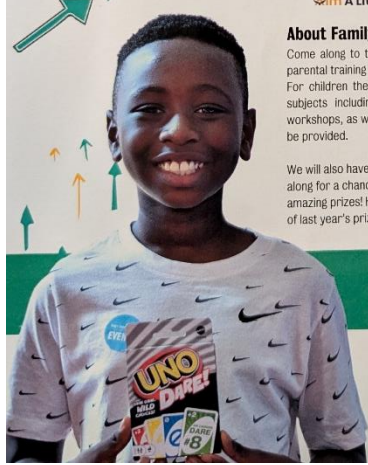
