### Routine:

### Little but Often:

Doing ten to fifteen minutes a night is more productive that an hour and half on a Sunday evening!

### **Encourage Independence:**

Allow your child to take ownership of their homework, but be ready to provide support and guidance when they need it - don't do it for them!

If your child does not understand what they are being asked to do even after you have offered support, be sure to tell their teacher.
