English



This term the children will be looking at stories filled with mystery and entertainment. They will write their own stories as well as writing in a range of genres such as diaries, dialogue, atmospheric setting descriptions and poetry. Children will have the opportunity to use drama to consolidate their understanding of texts being studied, whilst also helping to understand the sequencing of the text and how to incorporate dialogue into their writing. The class will be encouraged to edit and improve their own writing, finding ways to make their writing stronger. Some of their work will also be published.



Maths

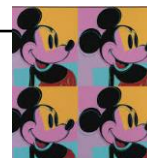


This term the class will be continuing to consolidate the mental maths strategies that they have learned, including being able to recall number bonds and times table facts. There will be opportunities for children to investigate mathematically and explain their reasoning.

Children will continue to work on their multiplication tables and by the end of this term are expected to be secure in x2, x3, x4, x5, x6, x7, x8, x9, x10, x11 and x 12. Theme Based Learning



The class topic this term is Romans. In History, the class will be learning about the Roman Empire and how it impacted Britain.

During Art, they will have the opportunity to study, and create their own Pop Art. During DT, they will learn about different food groups and have the opportunity to create their own fruit salad as part of a healthy diet.

The Science topic for this term is 'States of Matter'. The children will be deepening their knowledge of solid, liquids and gases.
